

# LOOKING UP!

W

hat gift will you give? The Greek word for forgive literally means "to give graciously; to give freely." God invites our participation in his grace through forgiveness. God's grace and love cannot be fully understood without us giving grace to others.

Jesus teaches God's grace as he demonstrates prayer and forgiveness with these simple, profound words: "forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors" (Matthew 6:12). Don't forget why or the implications of our words. Jesus continues, "For if you forgive others when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive them of their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins" (Matthew 6:14-15).

This teaching ought to wake us up. Jesus says that our forgiveness from God is proportionate to our willingness to forgive others. How are you doing with forgiveness? The plain truth is this: if you are refusing to forgive others, God is refusing to forgive you.

The Pharisees taught that a man should forgive and offense up to three times. Peter, knowing this tradition, presented an option making him twice as gracious, "seven times"? Jesus answered, in effect, "no, not seven times, but every time."

Jesus taught, "to understand forgiveness, we must remember what we have received." Forgiveness is always a gift. How can anyone who has been given much offer little in return? Read Hebrews 8:12 as both a gift from God and your promise to give to others, "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

### Mo Romans 11:36
